



# Susan Dory

Born 1964

Susan Dory begins each painting without a preconceived image in mind. Instead, she starts with a concept that has developed from reading, digesting visual information, and her interest in the spiritual world as well as a color palette she wants to explore. She works flat and uses acrylic paint at about the viscosity of house paint and clear acrylic medium. The first step in the process is to brush paint onto the canvas in a pattern or shapes that reflect her original idea. Then she pours on clear coat, a type of acrylic varnish, to seal it. The ideas develop throughout each layer and this process continues until the painting is completed. Final works may involve twenty or more layers.

# **ARTIST STATEMENT**

The new paintings further investigate my interest in metaphysical phenomenon. I am interested in the concept of Indra's Net as a metaphor to describe the universe, existence and the interconnection among all things - a huge statement. Quoting Stephen Mitchell:

"The Net of Indra is a profound and subtle metaphor for the structure of reality. Imagine a vast net; at each crossing point there is a jewel; each jewel is perfectly clear and reflects all the other jewels in the net, the way two mirrors placed opposite each other will reflect an image ad infinitum. The jewel in this metaphor stands for an individual being, or an individual consciousness, or a cell or an atom. Every jewel is intimately connected with all other jewels in the universe, and a change in one jewel means a change, however slight, in every other jewel."

I am inspired by the work of artists like Agnes Martin and El Anatsui. I feel they too explore the unseen, underlying support systems that exist in the world. Martin, with her restrained investigation of the line and grid and the sheer visual power of her work subsumes me into a

meditative state. El Antsui's majestic installations/hangings/sculptures and his elaborate process and materials render me speechless.

My work is process oriented. There are always several ideas to explore and work out throughout the act of painting, there is always an intended direction as a starting point. Yet often, glimpses of a revelation occur throughout the making of the painting that is fully discernable only when the painting is complete. To quote the sculptor Ted Larsen, "Meaning comes after making". I love that statement.

Color is an extremely important part of my process. I relate to Joseph Albers' idea that color is relational, that a certain color responds and changes when juxtaposed with another color. Color often takes over and directs the painting process. When things are going very well in the studio, the laying down of colors moves from beyond an intuitive spark into a kind of unyielding knowing.

I mentally collect colors that I see in the world. Some inspirational ideas/places/things for the palette I employ in this body of work are informed by the saturated, synthetic and natural colors in Mexico City and India; weavings by women artists in the *Bauhaus* school, including work by Benita Otte, Gunta Stolzl, Annie Albers, Gertrud Arndt, and Otti Berger; the amazing fabrics and color combinations in recent Gucci fashion collections; the bold, saturated, lovely richness of jewel tone colors in the paintings I recently saw at the Barnes Foundation retrospective of Chaim Soutine; and the wild, surprising colors and forms in the world of mushrooms and fungi in general along with the genius of Paul Stamets. Have you seen the movie *Fantastic Fungi* yet? I hope you can see it!
